Looking to the future, we are exploring ideas about how to expand these tools even further. Anticipation of user needs and habits as well as resources for customization will take things to the next level.


This presentation will look at how three sample users currently interact with UTD, how their experience will improve in the personalized tomorrow, and how we could further improve their outcomes in a more customized future.








Dr. Ramirez is a GP in a mobile clinic. He sees a large number patients each day, and handles a diverse variety of medical issues across age ranges.




Dr. Ramirez currently uses UpToDate while moving fast.

- he regularly checks UTD on a mobile device
- because he sees such a mix of patient types, he often checks treatment and dosage specifics within topics
- he frequently searches for the same calculators over and over
- he doesn't have time to explore everything the app has to offer, so has no awareness of PCUs




Soon, Dr. Ramirez will be able to:

- bookmark content he uses regularly, such as calculators
- access those bookmarks from a convenient homepage widget
- annotate individual topics with his own notes, such age-related specifics or unusual cases
- see flagged topic updates, leading to new awareness of outcome-improving PCUs




In the future, Dr. Ramirez could:

- sort his bookmarks into folders
- search his annotations to quickly reference his own notes
- view a suggested topics list based on his daily schedule of patients
- get **institution notifications** from the mobile clinic's parent hospital
- view trending topics based on location
- receive **push notifications** for topic updates
- copy and cite to close the loop on patient visits
- customize his UTD homepage dashboard to show the specific content and shortcuts that will save him valuable time




Meet Dr. Rosen








Dr. Rosen is an attending physician at a university hospital. She supervises fellows, residents and med students, and is also a professor at the medical school.




Dr. Rosen uses UpToDate for research and education.

- see topic updates quickly and easily from a convenient homepage widget




In the future, Dr. Rosen could:

- customize her UTD homepage dashboard to showcase her meticulously organized content and recommendations

Meet Dr. Ray















Dr. Ray is a pediatrician with an independent practice. She leads a small core staff and puts extra effort into staying on top of the latest news and updates within her specialty.




Dr. Ray uses UpToDate to stay informed.

- review her team's most viewed and history lists to track search activity within the practice




In the future, Dr. Ray could:
